² For darkness shall cover the earth,
and thick darkness the peoples;
but the Lord will arise upon you,
and his glory will appear over you.
³ Nations shall come to your light,
and kings to the brightness of your dawn.
⁴ Lift up your eyes and look around;
they all gather together, they come to
you;
your sons shall come from far away,
and your daughters shall be carried on
their nurses' arms.
⁵ Then you shall see and be radiant;
your heart shall thrill and rejoice,
because the abundance of the sea shall be
brought to you,
the wealth of the nations shall come to
you.
⁶ A multitude of camels shall cover you,
the young camels of Midian and Ephah;
all those from Sheba shall come.
They shall bring gold and frankincense,
and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord.

2nd Reading Ephesians 3.1-12

¹ This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner
for Christ Jesus for the sake of you
Gentiles—² for surely you have already
heard of the commission of God's grace that
was given to me for you, ³ and how the
mystery was made known to me by
revelation, as I wrote above in a few
words, ⁴ a reading of which will enable you to
perceive my understanding of the mystery of
Christ. ⁵ In former generations this mystery
was not made known to humankind, as it has
now been revealed to his holy apostles and
prophets by the Spirit: ⁶ that is, the Gentiles
have become fellow-heirs, members of the
same body, and sharers in the promise in
Christ Jesus through the gospel. ⁷ Of this
gospel I have become a servant according to
the gift of God's grace that was given to me
by the working of his power. ⁸ Although I am
the very least of all the saints, this grace was
given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news
of the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹ and to

make everyone see what is the plan of the
mystery hidden for ages in God who created
all things; ¹⁰ so that through the church the
wisdom of God in its rich variety might now
be made known to the rulers and authorities
in the heavenly places. ¹¹ This was in
accordance with the eternal purpose that he
has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹² in
whom we have access to God in boldness
and confidence through faith in him.

Gospel Reading Matthew 2.1-12

¹ In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was
born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from
the East came to Jerusalem,
² asking, 'Where is the child who has been
born king of the Jews? For we observed his
star at its rising, and have come to pay him
homage.'
³ When King Herod heard this, he was
frightened, and all Jerusalem with him;
⁴ and calling together all the chief priests and
scribes of the people, he inquired of them
where the Messiah was to be born.
⁵ They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for
so it has been written by the prophet:
⁶ "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,
are by no means least among the rulers
of Judah;
for from you shall come a ruler
who is to shepherd my people Israel."'
⁷ Then Herod secretly called for the wise
men and learned from them the exact time
when the star had appeared.
⁸ Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying,
'Go and search diligently for the child; and
when you have found him, bring me word so
that I may also go and pay him homage.'
⁹ When they had heard the king, they set out;
and there, ahead of them, went the star that
they had seen at its rising, until it stopped
over the place where the child was.
¹⁰ When they saw that the star had stopped,
they were overwhelmed with joy.
¹¹ On entering the house, the
y saw the child with Mary his mother; and
they knelt down and paid him homage. Then,
opening their treasure-chests, they offered
him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.
¹² And having been warned in a dream not to
return to Herod, they left for their own
country by another road.

The Psalm for today is Psalm 72, Verses 1 to 7 and 10 to 14.

¹ Give the king your judgement, O God: and your righteousness to the son of a king,

² That he may judge your people rightly: and the poor of the land with equity.

³ Let the mountains be laden with peace because of his righteousness: and the hills also with prosperity for his people.

⁴ May he give justice to the poor among the people:

and rescue the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor.

⁵ May he live while the sun endures: and while the moon gives light, throughout all generations.

⁶ May he come down like rain upon the new-mown fields:

and as showers that water the earth.

⁷ In his time shall righteousness flourish: and abundance of peace, till the moon shall be no more.

¹⁰ The kings of Tarshish and of the isles shall bring tribute: the kings of Sheba and Seba shall offer gifts.

¹¹ All kings shall fall down before him: and all nations do him service.

¹² He will deliver the needy when they cry: and the poor that have no helper.

¹³ He will pity the helpless and the needy: and save the lives of the poor.

¹⁴ He will redeem them from oppression and violence:

and their blood shall be precious in his sight.

Hello Dear Friends

Happy New Year to you all.

This Sunday we get to celebrate Epiphany. Our sentence tells us that the light has come and we pray that the bright light shines for all nations to be as one. Isaiah talks of the bright glories of the church of God when all people will come in. Psalm 72 sees David praying for Solomon and giving a prophesy regarding his reign and of Christ's kingdom. Paul talks to the Ephesians of his ministry, his qualifications, his call and the results of his works. And it being Epiphany, we hear of the Magi, their search and worship of Jesus.

Epiphany is always a day of contrasts for me - it's always memorable as it's the anniversary of my Mum's death - my reaction to her death was a most important part of my Christian journey and led me to a great epiphany of my own - an uncovering and revealing of the gift of God's grace and love and the understanding of forgiveness!!!

I found a story!!

Alan was recovering in hospital from a motorcycle accident. It was coming up to Christmas. One night as he lay in bed he looked out the window and noticed that the sky was full of stars. Suddenly he began to think about the Three Wise Men (Magi) and their journey to Bethlehem in search of the Christ Child.

Then he began to think about himself, something which up to then he had never really done. And he said to himself: 'Here I am, 23 years old, and what have I done with my life? What have I achieved?' The answer was 'nothing'. He was still living for thrills and excitement. He had wasted the best years of his life and had nothing to show for them.

Next, he thought about his relationship with the Lord. The Magi didn't have the Lord at the start of their journey. But they set out to look for him, and persevered until they found him. For him it was the opposite. He didn't have to go looking for the Lord. He had him from the very start. He was baptised and brought up a Christian. He went to church regularly until he was fifteen. But then he gave it all up. He lost the Lord. And instead of looking for him, he deliberately turned his back on him. More, he was in rebellion against him.

That was a very dark night for Alan: when all this came crowding in on him. But when the darkness was at its thickest a beautiful thing happened. It

was if the Lord's star rose before him, as he gazed out the window: and suddenly he realised that the Lord's light hadn't been extinguished. It had continued to shine all those years, except it was hidden by clouds. And a wonderful truth dawned on him: even though he had abandoned the Lord, the Lord had not abandoned him. All those years the Lord had been searching for him.

He was overcome with joy. He never thought that he mattered to anyone, least of all to the Lord. And he said to himself: 'From now on I have a star that will not play me false: I have a compass that will not lie to me'.

When the Magi found the Lord, they offered him wonderful gifts – gold, frankincense and myrrh. Now that Alan had found the Lord, what could he offer him: he thought? For a while he was at a complete loss. But then he realised there was something he could offer the Lord. He could offer the Lord, himself. But, of course, he would first of all have to find himself before he could offer himself as a gift to anyone else. However, he could at least make a start, and that he was determined to do right away.

Christmas came, and Alan remained in hospital. But people saw an amazing change in him. Up to this, he had been full of bitterness about life in general, and about his accident in particular. Now he had a smile and a cheerful word for everyone. People were puzzled as to what had produced this change in him. But Alan himself knew what it was. It was the fact that he had found the Lord. And as we know no one can truly find the Lord without being completely changed.

Years later he said: 'That was the first real Christmas in my life. No, I didn't hear angels singing in the sky. But I did experience some of the peace they sang about, on that first Christmas night'.

Everybody needs a star to follow, just as ships at sea need a lighthouse beacon to guide them safely to port. Truly blessed are we if the star of the Lord has risen before us and twice blessed are we if we follow that star steadfastly all our lives. Many spend their lives searching for what they already have, and do not find it.

We are indeed blessed!
